VANDE BHARAT EXPRESS

The first Vande Bharat Express train commenced its services in West Bengal on 30th December 2022. The train connects the city of Howrah with New Jalpaiguri.

Vande means "I praise" and Bharat means "India". So, the name of "Vande Bharat" literally means "I praise India". The name was chosen to reflect the train's status as a symbol of India's technological prowess and its commitment to providing world class passenger rail services.

It is the first train that was manufactured entirely in India. The train is powered by self-propulsion module, which means it does not require a locomotive to pull it. Vande Bharat can run upto a maximum speed of 160km/hr.

Regarding catering services, passengers will have to prebook their food. SMS will be sent for reconfirmation 24 to 48 hrs before the journey starts. In chair car class, passengers are provided with a vegetarian meal, which includes snacks lunch and dinner. In executive class, passengers are provided non-vegetarian meal.

All 41 workers Evacuated from Uttarakhand Tunnel After 17 Days

On November 12, 2023 a section of tunnel between 205 and 260 metres from the Silkyara side collapsed. Workers who were beyond the 260 - metre mark were trapped, with their exit blocked. Fortunately for them the part of the tunnel where they were stuck had power and water supply.

The Silkyara-Barkot Tunnel is a part of the Char - Dham project. The length of the tunnel is 4.5 kilometer.

Char Dham project aimed at providing all-weather connectivity between four prominent Hindu shrines in Uttarakhand, Badrinath, Kedarnath, Gangotri and Yamunotri. It is a double lane tunnel and one of the longest under Char Dham project.

After 17 harrowing days trapped underground, all 41 workers were successfully rescued from the collapsed Silkyara-Barkot tunnel in Uttarakhand.

The rescue operation, which involved a combined effort of the Indian Army, The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), SDRF and local authorities, became a symbol of human resilience and determination in the face of adversity.

Jehangir Ratanji Dadabhoy Tata (29 July, 1904 - 29 November, 1993) was an Indian aviator, industrialist, entrepreneur and Chairman of Tata Group. His mother was the first woman in India to drive a car and, in 1929, he became the first licensed pilot in India. He is also best known for being the founder of several industries under the Tata Group, including Tata Consultancy Services, Tata Motors, Titan Industries, Tata Salt, Voltas and Air India. In 1983, he was awarded the French Legion of Honour and in 1955 and 1992, he received two of India's highest civilian awards the Padma Vibhushan and the Bharat Ratna. These honours were bestowed on him for his contributions to Indian industry.

During his school days, he had a friend who used to lose his pen often. However, he never worried about losing them since he always used cheap pens.

One day he shared his worries about his habit of being careless to his friend JRD Tata. JRD Tata suggested him to buy the most expensive pen that he could afford. He then purchased a 22-carat gold pen.

After almost six months JRD Tata met him and asked him if he still loses his pen. He smiled and replied that now he was taking extra care of the pen so that he does not lose it. Tata then explained him that it's not his carelessness rather it's his way of valuing things which was ultimately leading to his carelessness or carefullness.





Breaking Myths: National Education Policy 2020

BOARD EXAMS FOR CLASS 10 and 12 will now be held twice a year

OTBA (Open Text Based Assessments) will now be implemented in CBSE Schools

FACT: At an event in Chhattisgarh's Raipur, Education Minister Pradhan said Board exams would be held twice a year from 2025-26 onward. The news was published in Newspapers like India Today. A second attempt at these exams is expected to reduce the pressure on students to perform. Students will have the option of retaining the best marks of the two attempts.


The news is based on an announcement made by the Education Minister. This is a follow up of the launch of the New Curriculum Framework by the Ministry of Education in August last year, which announced that Board exams would be held at least twice a year to ensure that students had the requisite time and opportunities to perform well. Parents can breathe a sigh of relief that no such thing will be implemented before 2025.

FACT: According to an article published in newspapers like The Economic Times, The Indian Express, etc., the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is planning a pilot run of Open-Book Exams (OBE) in selected schools for classes 9 to 12 later this year, according to officials. The idea was floated in the last governing body meeting of the CBSE Board in December, 2023.

Officials, however, said there is no plan to adopt the format in class 10 and 12 board exams. There is no news so far about its implementation.

Monsoon and Northern Landslide Conditions


Every year, the natural beauty of the mountains of North Bengal increases during the monsoons, but due to natural disasters like landslides, the life of the mountains and its adjacent people is greatly disrupted. And with that the balance of the related natural environment is also endangered.



The hills of North Bengal and its surrounding areas are mainly connected with National Highway 31 (Siliguri - Rangpo), NH 55 (Siliguri-Darjeeling via Kashiang) and State Highway 12 (Siliguri-Mirik). Its economic, commercial and administrative importance is immense. However, due to the heavy rains of the monsoon, these roadways fall under the influence of collapse every year, which sometimes temporarily or permanently cut off the communication system between the northern mountains and the adjacent plains. Not only this, due to these sudden collapses, the normal life of the people is disrupted, property is lost and, in many cases, lives are lost. Moreover, the balance of the natural ecosystem is disturbed in landslide disasters, soil erosion increases. However, although this collapse is mainly considered as a natural disaster, it is often aggravated by various unplanned human activities. Although continuous or heavy monsoon rains are one of the reasons for the collapse, uncontrolled felling of trees on the mountain slopes, settlements built in an unplanned way, shops, construction of tourist houses are also considered responsible. Therefore, to free the natural environment and human life adjacent to the hills of North Bengal from the effects of additional landslides, illegal construction on the hill slopes, tree felling should be stopped immediately with the help of the local administration. In this case, it is necessary to promote and increase awareness about landslide prevention among the residents living in the mountains.


