

TALES THROUGH TOYS

Reviving Folk Stories through Handmade Toys

This event brought a refreshing breath of tradition to the Stream Fest, inviting participants to step into the heart of India's storytelling heritage. This event celebrated the age-old charm of handcrafted artistry by asking teams to create toys using traditional Indian toy-making techniques such as air-dry clay, cloth, or paper-mâché. Each team was required to craft a set of three characters, with the central figure being sculpted live during the event—an element that added spontaneity and creative pressure to the narrative process. The judges of the event, Ms Sheela Chamaria, a sculptor, and Ms Shampa Bhattacharya, an artist, appreciated the creativity and reverence shown in each handcrafted piece that reflected both skill and soulful connection to heritage.

The remaining characters and accessories could be prepared in advance, allowing for a richer, more detailed presentation. Through these hand-molded figures, participants brought folk tales and social or cultural narratives to life, blending tactile craftsmanship with verbal storytelling. The toys, standing between six to eight inches tall, became vessels of ancestral wisdom and imagination, transforming the stage into a living tableau of India's diverse and vibrant traditions.

Art Alchemy: The Dhokra Fashion Show was a dazzling confluence of heritage and haute couture, where age-old craftsmanship met the pulse of contemporary design. The judges of the event, Mr Ravi Rajput, an Engineer, and Mr Aman Grewal (Mrs India 2014), expressed their admiration for the way each ensemble paid homage to the traditional elegance of Dhokra artistry while effortlessly merging it with contemporary fashion sensibilities.

Inspired by the intricate elegance of Dhokra—India's ancient bell metal art—this two-round event transformed the ramp into a living gallery of tribal brilliance. In the first round, models graced the stage in garments shaped from plain fabrics, their silhouettes defined by fluid drapery and the understated power of form, all set against the rhythmic backdrop curated by the host school. The second round gave voice to the vision behind the craft, as designers joined their models on stage to explain the inspirations and traditional techniques that brought their looks to life. At the heart of each ensemble was the handcrafted jewelry and headpiece, echoing the raw metallic textures and motifs characteristic of Dhokra craft. With elegance, restraint, and reverence for tradition, participants created a runway experience that was both rooted and radiant, bridging folk artistry and modern expression in one seamless stride.

The figures portrayed were not merely faces, but emblems of transformation—framed with metaphors, motifs, and visual cues that spoke volumes. Accompanying each portrait was a written explanation, a thoughtful reflection that deepened the viewer's understanding of both the individual depicted and the intention behind the artwork. Through this project, the canvas became a space for remembrance and recognition, allowing participants to bring to light those who inspire change, not with fame, but with purpose.

In this visionary event, students were tasked with crafting a r-2 minute cinematic trailer, either adapted from an existing literary work or born from an original idea, that captured the spirit of one or more United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Whether highlighting climate action, gender equality, or reduced inequalities, each trailer needed to showcase a clear narrative conflict, thematic depth, and impactful visual language. Participants were encouraged to experiment with live action, stopmotion, or digital editing techniques, while voiceovers, captions, and musical scores served as essential tools to enrich the storytelling experience. The trailers, formatted in r6:9 widescreen and free from copyrighted content, had to reflect originality in every frame, ensuring a presentation that was both socially relevant and artistically compelling. Submitted via Google Drive, the final entries represented more than just filmmaking—they became urgent, imaginative calls to action, echoing the belief that the stories we tell today can shape the world we inherit tomorrow.

Reviving Classical Tunes for Today's Audience



This high-voltage competition spotlighted the spirit of Western rock, as school bands took to the stage to deliver electrifying live performances of iconic English-language rock anthems. With at least six members per band- including lead and rhythm guitars, bass, drums, keyboard, and vocals- each ensemble was expected to create a rich and layered soundscape, entirely live and devoid of any pre-recorded tracks or backing vocals. The authenticity of rock pulsed through every chord and lyric, as bands lit up the stage with their presence, precision, and passion.

Dressed in school uniforms and armed with instruments of their own, performers were judged not just on technical execution but on their ability to embody the spirit of the genre while keeping the content school-appropriate. With just 12 minutes to set up, perform, and exit, every second became a beat in a larger anthem—a testament to the power of collaboration, performance, and the universal language of music.

Participants engineered bots within strict dimensions and power constraints, crafting machines that could be wired, wireless, or autonomous- all prepared to conquer a dynamic obstacle course brimming with complexity.

From navigating sharp turns and speed bumps to charging through ramps and tunnels, each challenge demanded both mechanical finesse and sharp decision-making. With only one participant at the controls and limited restarts, every second on the track was a test of strategy and stability. Designed to fit within a 20x20x20 cm frame and capped at 5 kg, the bots reflected a perfect balance of form, function, and firepower. As teams raced against the clock, their creations surged forward—part machine, part marvel—vying not only for victory, but for the recognition that comes from pushing boundaries and bringing engineering brilliance to life.

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
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TOLSTOY STIME LOOP Literature through Time


The Ultimate Courtroom

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

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
