CHILDREN'S DAY - A TRIBUTE TO NEHRU

Every year, on November 14, India celebrates Children's Day. It is not just a special day for children but also a tribute to Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, India's first Prime Minister, who believed that children are the foundation of a nation's future. Whether addressing a gathering of leaders or visiting a school, he always found time to connect with the youngest hearts around him. 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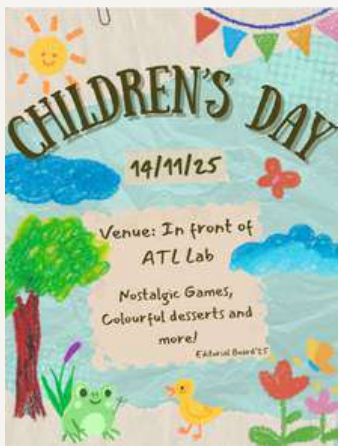
